The Wayne County Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order by chairman Terry Sievers at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, June 4, 2024, in the Wayne County Courtroom. Chairman Sievers, Members Dean Burbach and Jim Rabe, Deputy Attorney Ted Lohrberg, Sheriff Jason Dwinell and Deputy Clerk Joni Tietz were present. Notice of the meeting was published in the Wayne Herald, a legal newspaper, on May 23, 2024. A copy of the Open Meetings Act was posted and accessible to the public.

Chairman Sievers presented the following consent agenda items:

- a. Approve the May 21, 2024 minutes as printed in the Commissioners Record
- b. Approve payroll; commissioners abstain from approving a personal claim

The consent agenda was approved on a motion made by Rabe and seconded by Burbach. Roll call vote: Rabe, Burbach, Sievers-aye; motion carried.

Emergency Manager, Nic Kemnitz, gave the commissioners an update on his plans. He will be attending drone training in West Point. Elkhorn Valley Local Emergency Planning Committee is having a HAZMAT Night Out Event in Wisner on Monday, June 10. He also met with the Hoskins Village Board in regard to the Q125 celebration.

Wayne County Historical Society members came before the Board to request that the County increase the Historical Society's yearly contribution to \$25,000, with \$5000 being split between Wayne and Winside. It was noted that they are trying to make necessary repairs to the Museum and want to begin marketing campaigns. There has not been an increase in the yearly contribution for many years.

Heidi Borg from Adrian Smith's Office informed the Board that 80 of 93 counties are in Smith's district. Since 2010, he has served on the Ways and Means Committee promoting market access for Nebraska products. His office is trying to visit every County Board across the district.

NACO representative, Judd Allen, apprised the board of the options NACO has available regarding health insurance.

Burbach made a motion to enter into a three-year contract with Maximus and Rabe seconded said motion. Maximus calculates the contract figures for Wayne County's child support reimbursement from the state. Roll call vote: Burbach, Rabe, Sievers-aye; motion carried.

A follow up to the Allo install was presented by Pat Brentlinger, maintenance director. Most glitches have been taken care of. All phones and internet are working properly.

The claims were approved on a motion made by Burbach and seconded by Rabe. Roll call vote: Burbach, Rabe, Sievers – aye; motion carried.
